You'll also get an exclusive sneak peek at what's coming up in the summer term including special events, new projects, and opportunities for pupils to shine.

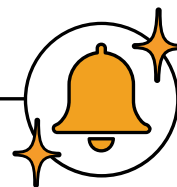

At the heart of the production was the unwavering commitment of both staff and pupils, whose countless hours of preparation and rehearsal paid off.

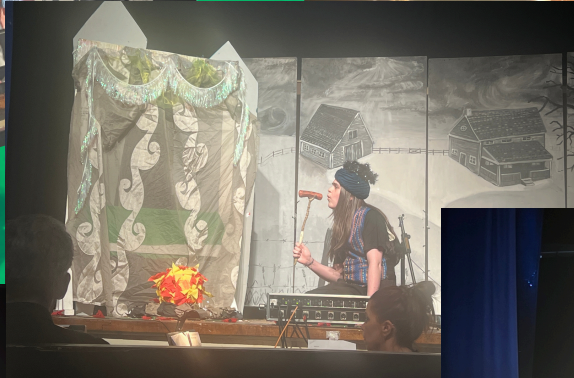
