Pupils will be able to collect results from 08.30 onwards to 10.30am from our main reception. For **GCSE, BTEC and Vocational results**, pupils will be able to collect results from 08.30 onwards to 12.00pm **on Thursday 20th August from the Steynton Hall**. Please be aware, as is always the case, that you cannot collect results on behalf of any pupil without pre-arranged and written consent. Any uncollected results will be posted out to pupils at the end of the school day.

I would like to again thank our parents/carers for continuing to support and encourage our pupils to follow our high expectations and school rules of **READY, RESPECT, SAFE**. This includes: arriving at school on time, wearing the correct uniform, being respectful and courteous to staff and peers and continuing with a positive learning attitude and behaviour. In addition our focus for next year is to improve pupil attendance. Every day that your child is absent from school will lower their chances of achieving 5 or more good GCSEs, including English and Maths. Being persistently late will also have an impact on their learning. I look forward to your support in helping to teach our young people the importance of turning up daily and being punctual.
