Little and often revision is far more powerful than long nights cramming for hours. ★ Use BBC Bitesize revision on the topic too! Think about why that event was significant and why. Think about the author and whether the source is limited or biased. You can do this for your Historical sources but also for anything you are given to read or watch. Question whether it is useful and reliable. |
